Community Woodland progress

ZCH continues to support Long Lands
Common - Community Woodland &
Nature Recovery Project. Having received
approval from the Forestry Comission to
the woodland creation plan, DEFRA
funding was secured to plant a new
boundary hedge, followed by a £27,120
funding agreement with White Rose
Forest for woodland, tree nursery, site
office and education space. Work on the



second funding agreement with White Rose Forest is underway.

20's Plenty for Harrogate

ZCH added its support to a petition delivered to North Yorkshire Council on 12th May (photo courtesy of the Stray Ferret). Initiated by parents concerned about children's safety when travelling to school, the petition calls for a 20mph limit in south and west Harrogate. Twenty zones are a cost effective way of enhancing road safety, reducing noise pollution and encouraging active travel.





ZCH supports Station Gateway

ZCH Chair, Jemima Parker, presented a statement of support to North Yorkshire Council's Harrogate & Knaresborough Area Committee, saying that the scheme would "add Harrogate to the list of forward-thinking, climate-crisis responsive places, that prioritise infrastructure for pedestrians and public transport users ahead of private car drivers". Members voted 10:3 in favour of the scheme. A final decision will be made by the Council's Executive Committee on 30th May.
