North Yorkshire Council's electricity to be carbon neutral

North Yorkshire Council came into being on 1st April and has decided to go carbon neutral on its electricity purchases. That's important because it buys £18m worth in a year.

For the 2023-24 financial year, the Council will purchase electricity generated from a range of sources, but none will involve the burning of fossil fuels. This is in contrast to 2022-23 purchases when almost half came from gas or coal-fired power stations. We want our local services to be delivered as carbon neutral as possible, even if there's a tiny bit more on our Council Tax bills to achieve that.

North Yorkshire's slice of the Shared Prosperity Fund

Part of the government's levelling up agenda, the <u>UK Shared Prosperity Fund</u> will provide £2.6 billion of funding for local investment by March 2025. The funding for North Yorkshire of almost £15m, will be delivered against five themes:

- addressing rurality and inequality
- building pride in our places
- boosting productivity
- decarbonising communities and businesses
- supporting an active labour market.

North Yorkshire Council and the York & North Yorkshire Local Enterprise Partnership (Y&NY LEP) are looking to build capacity for community climate action, with sessions in Skipton, Selby and Scarborough. These are for community groups and residents who have an interest in engaging with climate action, reducing energy costs and becoming more sustainable.
