Nature groups warn against playing political football

As the Women's World Cup unfolds, there's another global football game being played and that's the UK government's worrying position on climate change, where it appears to have shifted the goalposts. Despite global 'boiling', the government is threatening to backtrack on its environmental commitments for political gain.

Representing over 20 million supporters, 50 of the most respected environmental organisations, including the National Trust, CPRE, RSPB, RSPCA, Wildlife Trusts, Woodland Trust, WWF, Marine Conservation Society, Soil Association and Friends of the Earth have written to the Prime Minister, heavily criticising the government's potential plans to water down its commitment on almost every aspect of environmental policy.

At ZCH we believe that climate risks are too high to be playing a game of party politics. We'll only be winners in this championship if we all work together as one team and take every chance we have to score decarbonisation goals.
